Blended/Online Learning in the SEM Lab School for 2022-2023

Dear Parents and Students,

We would like to let you know of an important Blended/Online Learning change for the 2022-23 school year. We know that the best way to meet students' needs and support their success is through in-person interaction and instruction. In addition, the State of Ohio requires that students who complete their education through an online platform must attend school in person for more than 50% of the school week. Therefore, Union Local SEM Lab School Blended Learning/Online program will now have the requirement that students who participate in our Blended/Online Learning program must attend the Union Local Learning Center in person three days per week at a minimum. Online/Blended Learning is available to students in grades 6-12 only.

If you would like your child to be considered for participation in our district's Blended/Online Learning program in our Lab School, please check the box below indicating your choice, fill in the blanks, and forward it to either the Learning Center/Lab School located in the High School, the Middle School office, or the High School office.
