# UNION LOCAL BOARD OF EDUCATION FACILITY COMMITTEE November 5, 2024 7:30 AM

The Facilities Committee of the Union Local Board of Education met on November 5, 2024 at 7:30 AM in the Central Office Conference Room with the following present: Superintendent Zac Shutler; Treasurer Bernie Thompson; Board Members Shaun Roe; Vice-Assistant Administrator Mike Menges; Maintenance Director Jim Hess and Athletic Director Nick Nardo.

- 1. PM Agreement Options HE Neumann Preventative Maintenance Agreement. Over 200 pieces of equipment. Currently not receiving preventative maintenance. There are 3 different tiers. The tier that might fit us is the \$38,000 agreement. That agreement would be servicing the equipment 2x per year. What we would need, is a cost benefit analysis. Jim will work with Bernie to get us a 2-3 rolling average of cost to see if it makes fiscal sense.
- 2. Roofing Contacted companies about: Fieldhouse (multiple leaks), Concessions Stands (baseball and football), and Maintenance Building. Two quotes. One from an Amish Company. Roughly \$60,000. Kalkreuth would be \$138,000 for all three. Conversation with Mansuetto Roofing Discussion with facility roofs to streamline installation.
- 3. Softball Field Major issues with the dirt. Not much dirt left. It is down to gravel when it is dragged. Drainage is bad, especially around home plate. About \$12,000 worth of dirt and material to redo the field. Quote from Belmont Mills.
- 4. Next steps if the bond fails Adjust and Run it again?
- 5. Next steps if the bond passes Move forward?
- 6. Immediate needs at each building / facility Elementary Needs Sewage smell appeared to be drains that needed flushed. Roof leaks in the library and the stage. Safety issue at playground with the dip and the gravel. Middle School Basketball Court Quote \$186,000. High School Gym Redesign and Sealing \$40,000. Lighting for the Football Field.
- 7. How do we address the needs not included in the bond Fieldhouse, Maintenance Roof, Bus Garage Lot, Athletics Low interest loan exploration.

## UNION LOCAL BOAD OF EDUCATION FINANCIAL RESOURCE COMMITTEE MEETING November 12, 2024 7:30 AM

The Financial Resource Committee of the Union Local Board of Education met on November 12, 2024 at 7:30 AM in the Central Office Conference Room with the following present: Superintendent Zac Shutler; Treasurer Bernie Thompson; Special Education Director Jayme Yonak, Baird- Mike Burns.

#### Items below were discussed:

72% defeat - Results from November ballot

Discussed Loan/Lease option to repair roof, lighting and track. We would need around \$1,000,000 to cover the above expenses.

- Payment would be about \$100,000 a year.
- This would be competitively bid out to approximately 50 banks. UL would select the bank they want to go with.
- The loan would need to be paid back in 15 years
- Banks typically won't consider loans under \$1,000,000

If we go with a Loan/Lease option, we will need to either:

- Get quotes, bid out to see the costs
- Or get financing beforehand and then get quotes
- Recommend to get quotes first to see how much it is actually going to cost the district for the repairs of the roof, lights and track. This would ensure that we had enough money to cover the projects.
- Overall, our credit is really good, but can we afford \$100,000 a year for the lease payment? (We may need to give something up to cover the cost. If that is the case, we could do something like attrition.

#### **BOND ISSUE:**

Mike commended Zac for his efforts and said many times that he did a really good job with the interviews, newspapers, surveys, etc. He noted that only 40% of the bond issues passed and those bonds were in the blue parts of our state.

Moving forward, we have 4 options:

- 1. Don't do anything (Mike doesn't think this is the answer)
- 2. Go back with the same exact amount (Mike doesn't recommend reducing it. This may really cause skepticism with our voters.)
- 3. Switch it up and do an income tax. This is more expensive for people but might pick up some naysayers on a reduced budget.
- 4. Combo deal: property tax and income tax

## Other factors to consider:

- \$321 is the average home property tax for the bond if it passed
  - o This payment/money ends once the bond has been paid in full
- \$550 would be the average income tax payment for the bond if it passes
  - o Advantage of income tax is that it would be continuing. It isn't short-lived.
- Our average defeat for bonds/levy's is 68%
- Bernie noted that he really thinks that the tax re-evaluation really hurt our efforts for the bond issue this time.
- . We must decide in November if we want it on the ballot in May
